Resident Directors

RDs are full-time professional staff members that live and work in the residence halls. Each RD oversees the operation of his or her respective residential communities. They serve oncall to respond to any emergencies on campus. Any questions about the building itself can be directed towards this staff member.

Conference Managers (CMs)

CMs are experienced staff members that work directly with our visiting conferences. CMs serve as RDs during the academic year and take on extra responsibilities as conference managers during the summer months; making sure all group needs are met and supervising the CH staff. These staff members possess a vast amount of knowledge about New Mexico State University and the Las Cruces area.

Conference Hosts (CHs)

CHs are upperclassmen student staff that work the resident hall front desk areas and are a great resource for information. They can handle anything from checking in visitors to giving directions. If you have a question about something, visiting your CH is a great place to start.

Residence Hall Policies and Access

Conference Staff

For your convenience, NMSU Conference Staff are available daily at the Conference Office in the Garcia lobby, between 12:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Additionally, our Conference Host (CH) staff are on-call 24 hours per day. Conference Hosts have been trained to deal with a variety of situations. If you need assistance after hours, call (575) 646-1701. All Conference Hosts live in campus housing and their doors can be identified by their door decorations. Please feel free to ask our staff for assistance or information.

Conference Desk & Check In

The Conference Desk is staffed 7 days a week from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. Check-in will occur at the Conference Desk, located in Garcia Hall. Please be ready to present a picture ID upon check-in. Your keys will be issued to you, along with any other pertinent conference information. When the desk is closed, a staff member may be contacted by calling (575) 646-1701.

The Halls

Please keep in mind we are a university residence hall and are unable to provide hotel-style services such as wake-up calls, luggage transport or room service. We do promise to provide guests with a clean and well-maintained facility. Our staff is more than willing to provide directions, information and suggestions for sampling the many wonderful experiences in and around the Las Cruces community.

Elevators

Elevators exist in some residence halls for the convenience of participants and their guests. Elevators must be used properly. Misuse may result in temporary loss of service and/or a service charge for repairs resulting from that misuse. Please notify a Conference Host staff member immediately if an elevator failure occurs.

Rooms

Each person in your room is provided with a single bed, desk, chair, and closet space. Please do not remove furniture from the room or bring lounge furniture into the rooms. Occupants will be charged for the cost of returning furnishings to appropriate locations, the cost of replacing/repairing missing furnishings, damage to the room or the need for excessive cleaning. We ask that you dispose of all trash in the dumpsters before check out. Please report any maintenance issues to the Conference Office or the Front Desk.

Keys

You will be issued two types of keys. Your hard key(s) will grant you access to your actual room (and bedroom if staying in the apartments). Your exterior access swipe card will grant you access to the exterior of the building.

Access to Residence Halls

To enter your residence halls:

- Swipe your exterior access car in the card reader to unlock the exterior building door. Once the green light flashes, the door is unlocked.
- Please show your guest card to the Campus Host desk for identification purposes.
 Please be patient with requests to show your card or identification upon entering a residence hall since they are for your protection.

Room Lock-Outs and Lost Keys

If you find yourself locked out of your room, simply report your lock out to the Conference Host at the front desk in Garcia Hall. Desk is staffed 12:00 p.m.- 8:00 p.m. 7 days a week. If it is after those hours please call (575) 646-1701. You will be given a spare key and 10 minutes to go and retrieve the key left in the room. If you fail to return the spare, the room key is considered lost, and you will be charged a new key fee. If a Summer Guest Card is lost, please report it immediately by contacting the Conference Host at Garcia Hall. This will "freeze" your account and help keep our buildings secure. Parents/ guardians and conference leaders are not permitted to check out any keys other than their own.

Prohibited Item/Activities

Illegal Drugs

Illegal drugs (including medical marijuana), and illegal prescription drug paraphernalia are not permitted in the residence halls at any time. **This policy applies to all guests regardless of age.** Any guest found in violation of this policy may be removed from campus without a refund.

Weapons

The possession, use or sale of weapons is strictly prohibited on University property. Weapons include, but are not limited to, knives, blades, clubs, firearms and fireworks.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in all University facilities, including residence halls. Designated smoking areas are outside 50 feet from all buildings. Smoking is not permitted in the Patios.

Open Flames

The possession or use of candles and incense is prohibited in guest rooms. Guest many not have open flames in their rooms due to fire and safety regulations.

Alcoholic Beverages

The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages by anyone under the age of twenty-one (21) is prohibited by New Mexico law. Participants over the age of 21 may privately consume alcoholic beverages in their rooms. Consuming alcohol in public areas of any residential community (including patios), anywhere on campus outside the residential communities, within participant rooms as a part of organized social gatherings or when individuals under the age of 21 are present, is strictly prohibited.

Pets

Certified service animals are the only animals allowed and must be pre-registered and approved prior to arrival.

Safety & Security

<u>Personal safety and property protection are very important to us. Please help us by practicing the following safety precautions:</u>

- " Always lock your door. The University is not responsible for the theft or loss of money or personal belongings.
- "Do not admit unknown persons to the building and do not leave purses and luggage unattended.
- " Escort your guests at all times.
- "Do not prop open doors leading to the residential areas or the exterior of the building.
- "The building entrance doors are locked from 8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. and doors leading to residential areas are locked at all times.
- " Please report all lost keys immediately.

In the event of a fire or any other emergency requiring the evacuation of the building, please exit the Hall through the nearest patio door. Once outside, report to your group sponsor for accountability purposes. Please do not re-enter the building until given permission to do so by the appropriate fire department/police staff.

Visitation/ Guest Policy

Short-term guests are permitted to visit residents for no more than one night provided that the host's roommate(s) / suit-mate(s) agree. Guests must be escorted at all times. Hosts are responsible for guest behavior and conduct at all times. Guests may not sleep in public or common areas. Providing access to unassigned residential spaces is prohibited.

Parking

Parking is readily available adjacent to the hall or apartment complex at which you are staying. Campus parking is patrolled and requires a permit. Improperly parked vehicles and vehicles without a permit displayed on the vehicle's dash may be ticketed and/or towed (fines & fees at the owner's expense).

You may obtain a free one day parking permit from our Parking Department website. Be sure to park in only the parking lots designated by your permit. Parking is not included in the summer housing fee for NMSU students. Parking is NOT enforced Monday-Friday, after 4:30 pm and on weekends. Please make sure you have a parking permit displayed if you are parking anywhere on campus Monday – Friday from 5:00 am- 4:30am.

Quiet Hours

New Mexico State University residence halls observe 24-hour courtesy hours. This means that noise should always be kept at a reasonable level to respect other guests. Official quiet hours are 9:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. daily. Official quiet hours mean that noise should be kept to a minimum so as to not disturb other guests. Please operate radios, televisions, stereos, etc. so as not to disturb other guests.

University Property

Residents will be held responsible for damage to residence halls or furniture and will be billed for repair or replacement where they have caused damage in their own rooms or in common areas.

Checking Out of NMSU

In order to check out of your room, all items should be removed from the residence hall with the door to your room closed and locked. Conference guests should leave linens in their room as found at check-in. All garbage should be disposed of in the dumpsters prior to check out.

Check-out is scheduled from 12 - 8 p.m. on the day that you are scheduled for check out. If you remain in the room after this time, you will be charged for an additional night.

You may complete traditional check-out at the Summer Conference desk located in Garcia Hall. Guests should bring their key to sign and date all keys back to the NMSU Conference staff. Lost keys will incur a charge. For security reasons, the university cannot accept keys mailed back after your departure.

Emergencies, Policies, and Procedures

On-Campus Emergencies

Crime, Fire, and Medical Emergencies

For any on-campus emergency requiring police, fire, or medical response:

University Police and Security

University police are commissioned law enforcement officers. On duty 24 hours a day, they have full investigative and arrest authority on campus. Officers respond to all reported emergencies- crime, fire, medical, or other- and coordinate with Las Cruces fire and police departments. They regularly patrol campus grounds and buildings and maintain close contact with residence hall staff to ensure privacy and security. The NMSU Police Department is responsible for all criminal and traffic law enforcement on just over 180 square miles of land owned and/or controlled by the Board of Regents of NMSU, serving a daytime campus population of over 32,000 and a residential population of around 6,000. While routine patrol is conducted on the approximately 5 square miles of the main campus, officers of the NMSU Police Department will patrol the college ranch and other outlying campuses and research sites as staffing allows.

Escort Service

The NMSU Escort Service (646-1111) is provided by the Associated Students of New Mexico State University (ASNMSU). This service provides a person to walk you from one location to another. The area covers ranges from student housing to two blocks off-campus. Even though NMSU is not considered a dangerous campus, the Escort Service provides the added feeling of safety by ensuring students don't have to walk alone at night. The service is provided free of charge to students and is available from sundown until 12:30 am. Sunday – Thursday.

Emergency Stations

Emergency stations are located in many areas throughout the campus. They are easily identified by blue lights and have an emergency telephone attached. As you park or walk around the campus, make note of where the emergency stations are located. Do not try to apprehend a suspicious person yourself; <u>let the police respond.</u>

Emergency Evacuation Procedure

Evacuation procedures are posted on the back of your residence hall room door. If you hear the fire alarms going off you must evacuate IMMEDIATLEY.

If you discover a fire, pull the nearest fire alarm, leave the area, and call 9-1-1. Everyone should vacate the area and leave the building by the nearest accessible stairway. Do NOT use the elevators under any circumstances during a fire alarm.

Off-Campus Emergencies

The NMSU and Las Cruces areas are very safe. Nevertheless, you should always be alert, especially at night and when traveling alone.

For off-campus emergencies (Police, Medical, Fire) **DIAL 9-1-1** on any public pay phone and give your name, location of emergency, and nature of the problem. Do not hang up until the dispatcher has acknowledged all information.

Campus Amenities

Internet Access

Internet is provided to each guest. New Mexico State University has both wired and wireless connections.

- If you have a University ID#: To receive access you will need your NMSU username and password
- o **If you do NOT have a University ID#**: Check with your group sponsor to see if your group has been set up with a username and password to access the internet. You may request guest internet access at www.netreg.nmsu/guest. Access may take up to 24 hours to grant. It is strongly suggested that this be set up prior to arrival on campus.

If you have any problems connecting to the internet, contact Information & Communication Technologies (ICT) at (575) 646-1840.

If you do not bring a computer with you this summer, you may use university computers in the library, LaVista Learning Center (located 3rd floor of Garcia Hall), or other computer labs.

Materials:

- Ethernet cable *You will need to supply your own Ethernet cable if you are using a direct Ethernet connection; you can purchase one at the Campus Bookstore.
- First, find the Ethernet port in your residence. This port will look similar to the phone
 jack, but will be colored orange. In some residences, there will be a single wall
 mount with two Ethernet ports, one for each student. In other residences, there will
 be two or more wall mounts with a single Ethernet port near the desk in your room.
- 2. *Note: There is also an Ethernet port in the living room in Chamisa Village
- 3. When you have found the **Ethernet port**, plug one end of your **Ethernet cable** into the **Ethernet port**. Now plug the other end of the Ethernet cable into your computer's **Ethernet port**.

4. The first time you bring up the Internet with your direct Ethernet connection, you will see the NMSU Network Registration page (http://netreg.nmsu.edu/). Follow the registration instructions to connect to the NMSU Network and use the NMSU campus Internet.

- **IMPORTANT**: Your computer will need to be registered for NMSU resident wireless (Resnet) and again for NMSU campus wireless (Aggie-Air).

Reporting a Maintenance Problem

To report a maintenance or housekeeping problem, please notify the Conference Host at your front desk immediately. They will report the issue, and a member of facilities will attend to it as soon as possible.

<u>Laundry</u>

For your convenience, laundry rooms are located throughout the residence halls and apartment complexes. Each laundry room consists of at least 2 washers and 2 dryers. Each washing and drying cycle cost \$1.00. These machines <u>only</u> accept quarters as payment. Please use only HE (high efficiency) detergent to avoid complications.

Mail Services and Packages

Mail services are provided to any NMSU guest staying over 1 week. If you are staying in Pinon, or Garcia then your mailboxes are located in Garcia Hall Lobby. If you are staying in Chamisa Village then your mailboxes are located in Chamisa next to the main desk. Upon arriving at NMSU you will receive a mailbox key. Residence hall front desks will only accept packages (USPS, UPS, FedEx, DHL, Flower Services, ect.) for residents who have already checked in. Packages are not accepted in the anticipation of you arrival or after your departure. If a package arrives and a guest has not checked in or has already checked out, it will be returned to sender.

Linen Service

Linens will be provided for guests with contacted linen services at check-in. If you require your linens to be replaced please contact the Conference Host at the Garcia Hall Desk. If your conference organizer arranged linen exchange service as part of your housing reservation, bedding should be provided upon arrival. If you are staying with us more than 7 days, you will be able to exchange your linens every seventh day from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Conference Desk in the lobby.

Exercise Facilities

For information about using the exercise facilities on campus please contact your group sponsor and/or conference hosts; either Conference Services or the Housing Conference Host. The Activity Center and Natatorium on campus may be accessed for a daily fee.

Residence Hall Kitchens

Kitchens are available in each residence hall. Most kitchens have a fridge, microwave, oven/stove, a sink, and countertop. When using the kitchen, please:

- Clean after every use. Do not leave things out in the kitchen when you are finished. Cleaning staff may discard items that are left out.
- Do not leave anything unattended and please watch food carefully. It only takes an instant for something to catch fire.

It is prohibited to use any broiler oven, electric coffee maker, popcorn maker, hotplate, open burner, or electric water heating device in student rooms, on carpeted floors, in hallways, or other non-designated areas. You may use these appliances in the kitchen areas.

Apartment Kitchens

Kitchens are available in each of the apartments. Kitchens include microwave, fridge, stovetop, and oven.

- Do not leave anything unattended and please watch food carefully. It only takes an instant for something to catch fire.
- Clean after ever use. Also remember to clean out fridge of food that may be past its expiration date.

Airport Information

El Paso Airport (1hr/ 54 miles from NMSU)

El Paso International Airport (ELP) is the gateway to West Texas, Southern New Mexico and Northern Mexico. It provides airline passenger services, air cargo, and general aviation services. The Airport is favored with abundant land (nearly 7,100 acres) and beautiful flying weather.
